


capital city	The city where the government of a country is located.		
English Channel	A section of the Atlantic Ocean, between England and France.		
North Sea	A sea that is part of the Atlantic Ocean. It lies to the west of Great Britain.		
Irish Sea	A sea that is part of the Atlantic Ocean, between the islands of Ireland and Great Britain.		
Atlantic Ocean	A large area of salt water that is between Europe and Africa to the East and North and South America to the West. It is the world's second largest ocean.	Key Knowledge	Other information – UK mountain ranges and significant rivers.

villages	A small town or community, often in the country.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The seas surrounding the U.K are: The English Channel, North Sea, Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean. Key physical features of the U.K include, rivers, valleys, sea, mountains, hills, forests, cliffs and beaches. 	
towns	An area with streets, houses, and buildings that is larger than a village but usually smaller than a city.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Key human features of the U.K. include villages, towns, cities, harbours, factories, offices, farms, ports, houses and shops. Towns and countryside have similar and different geographical features.
