modern	Something considered new and having to do with the present or current times.		
chronological	The order in which things happen or have already happened.		
traditional	Relating to customs and ways of doing things in a particular culture that are passed down from parents to children.		<b>Other Information</b>
historical	Based upon and related to history (the past).		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>One of the oldest toys in Britain was found near Stonehenge – it's a carving of an animal, but we're not sure what kind of animal it is. Archaeologists think it's about 2,000 years old!</li></ul>
mechanical	Something that relates to the skill or use of machinery or tools.		 
clockwork	A mechanical system (mechanism) powered by the release of a coiled spring.		
invented	To have thought of, created, or come with, something new.		
material	Anything used for building or making something else.		
plastic	An invented substance (a material) that can be easily shaped when soft.		
metal	<b>Metals</b> are minerals like iron or lead that are found underground in rocks. These are separated from the rocks using heat. <b>Metals</b> are very useful materials.		
wood	An <b>organic</b> material, meaning it comes from nature. Wood comes from the trunks and branches of trees.		
china	A clear or white material that has been made from clay and hardened by heat.

You had to move a part of the toy to make another part move.</li><li>Now we have electricity - many modern toys are electrical and can move when you turn them on.</li></ul>
