


Refugee Week 2022



Last week, the whole school celebrated Refugee Week. It is an annual event that acknowledges the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees.

The theme for this year was 'Healing.'
We launched Refugee Week via our KS1 and KS2 Word of the Week assemblies, which introduced this year's theme to the children.
During the week, each class learned how refugees from all over the world have made Hackney their home and how they have positively contributed to our community. Each class then discussed what we can do to help welcome newcomers to Hackney by writing pledges of support which we displayed around the school.

In 6M this Refugee Week, we talked about what home meant to us, and created pledges and messages of support for those who have needed to leave their homes. We thought the little orange house was, symbolically, the perfect place to photograph our posters. Each one is a pledge or promise about how we will make (or are making) refugees feel welcome here.



Language of the Month


As you will have seen on the news over the last few months, the people of Ukraine have had to leave their homes to seek refuge in other countries to feel safe. England has already welcomed nearly 54,000 Ukrainians and so it is important for our school community to show our support in any way that we can. Kyryl (6M) and Taisiia (5B) recently came to England and joined William Patten which is why our new Language of the Month is Ukrainian. The Ukrainian language is an Eastern Slavic

language and is a part of the Indo-European language family. Ukrainian is the second most spoken Slavic language and it is the official language of <u>Ukraine</u>. There are 37 million speakers in Ukraine and most of them are native speakers, all over the world there are more than 50 million Ukrainian speakers in total. The Ukrainian language is one of the most widely spoken languages in the world, and by the number of speakers, it is the 26th in the world. We were very lucky to have Kyryl and Taisiia to help Helen introduce Ukrainian as the new Language of the Month to all of the classes in a virtual whole school assembly. They gave excellent pronunciation examples and led the whole school practising Ukrainian greetings and phrases! During the assembly, the teachers and children were able to practise Ukrainian greetings that they are going to use in the morning and afternoon register. We will also continue to use the Makaton signs alongside the greetings.

<u>Final Teaching for Mastery Workgroup at William</u> Patten


The final teaching for mastery workgroup took place at William Patten this week. Participating teachers from the schools we are supporting across the London North East Maths Hub came to observe a Y1 maths lesson on counting coins. The children successfully applied their knowledge of the cardinality of numbers (as well as counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s) to count different amounts of money. They then identified the different combinations of coins they could use to pay for different items. The children really enjoyed their lesson, working confidently and collaboratively. Our visitors also had many positive thing to say about what they learned about the lesson they observed and how this will inform practice in their own schools, including —

- I enjoyed the practical side of the lesson where children were engaged and were given the opportunity to manipulate the concrete resources along with the premoney tokens. This helped their understanding.
- (I learnt) the value of (using) pre-money tokens, the links between coins and multiplication, and the value of practical exchanges.
- (I will) continue using sentences with key vocabulary (and) create pre-money tokens to support children with in understanding the value of each coin.
- (I will) feedback to (our own) year 1 teachers

Feedback on the programme of support that William Patten has offered, has also been extremely positive, and the below is a representative example -

• I wanted to express my gratitude for all your support this year. I have thoroughly enjoyed all of the workgroups I have attended. My knowledge of the mastery approach has grown exponentially, as a result of (these) workshops. The value of seeing lessons in action can't be underestimated and I do understand all the work that goes into that and the generosity of sharing your practice with others.

The school will continue to be a Teaching for Mastery specialist school next year, and will continue its work to support other schools in developing their own teaching of maths according to recognised best practices. As a result, we will also continue to benefit from the expertise of the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM), who are working closely with as part of the national Maths Hubs initiative.
