The Blitz	The name given to the bombing raids that Germany launched against Britain in 1940, during World War II (1939–45).			Other information	
structure	A building or other object constructed from several parts. A shell structure is supported by its shape.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Anderson shelters were half buried in the ground with earth heaped on top to protect people from bomb blasts during World War Two.The Morrison shelter was constructed from heavy steel, and people could use them as a table.The Blitz, (September 7, 1940–May 11, 1941), intense bombing campaign undertaken by Nazi Germany against the United Kingdom during World War II.

Anderson Shelter	A small prefabricated air-raid shelter of a type built in the UK during the Second World War.	<p>Y2:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Different components can be joined effectively to make a freestanding structure.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The Anderson Shelter was designed (in 1938) by William Peterson and Oscar Carl Kerrison, in response to a request from the Home Office.		
Durability	The ability to withstand wear, pressure, or damage.		<ul style="list-style-type: none">It was named after Sir John Anderson, who was responsible for preparing air-raid precautions immediately before the start of WWIIAnderson shelters were very effective at saving lives and preventing injuries during the war		
Morrison Shelter	A movable air-raid shelter, shaped like a table with a cage-like construction beneath it.
