The William Patten roof garden is flourishing following recent hot and sunny weather. Our photos show -

A healthy array of dwarf sunflowers grown from the seeds planted by the EYFS classes. Currently been appreciated by the bees too!



Pumpkin plants in the Y1 bed, grown from seeds started in the classrooms. The flowers are starting to open, so we'll expect to see pumpkins on our return in September.



Leeks, grown from seed by year 3 initially, growing in the Year 2 beds. Although the bulbs planted by Y2 didn't grow in the beds, they grew well in the surrounding beds and are providing a beautiful backdrop.



Lettuce in the Y3 beds, which have been providing salad for at least the last 4 weeks! We hope to take leave cuttings one more time, before they bolt!



A mixture of cucumber plants, grown from seed in the year 4 classes and some promising courgette plants, donated to the school by Alex's Mum (Y5) - thank you Vicki!



Some very promising green tomatoes in the Y5 beds, which we're hoping will turn red for us to enjoy. Assorted peppers in the year 6 beds, to be added to the salad on the three final days of school.



Also in the greenhouse are the rest of the pepper plants grown by Y6 and some experimentally grown-from-seed melons, which we're hoping to be able to eat in the Autumn (with watering help from caretaker David, and assistant John).
