#### **Mastering Number in Year 5**

Representatives from 29 schools once again visited William Patten for training from the London North East Maths Hub. This time, as part of their visit, the teachers observed a 'Mastering Number' session in Y5. As there were so many visitors, the session took place in the top hall and the children once again demonstrated their excellent work ethic, engagement and mathematical thinking. Mastering Number is a national approach to developing children's number fluency, alongside a deeper conceptual understanding of number. In the year 5 session, children practised their recall of times tables and then applied these to mathematical problems, understanding the structure of the multiplication within each scenario. The participants were very complementary about their morning at William Patten, and were grateful to have had the chance to observe teaching and learning as part of their professional development. Children in Y4 and 5 will continue to use the approach, at the start of every maths lesson. A similar approach based on Mastering Number in KS1 is also in place for Y1 and 2.

#### **Ancient Greece – Olympic Games**

A busy week for Year 6, as they also starred in their own re-enactment of the first Olympic Games, as part of their History topic on Ancient Greece. Many facts were learnt and remembered, including the first couple of games only had one event - the 200m and women were not allowed to compete ③ They also learnt that later events included the javelin and wrestling. In keeping with the times, the victors were presented with olive leaf crowns!
