






Letters from Madrid



Early Years

On Wednesday 10th January, Nursery were very excited to start their gymnastic sessions with their Gymnastics teacher, Berry. The children listened to Berry's instructions throughout the session as they learnt some of the basic shapes in gymnastics including the straddle position, tuck position, pike position and present position as well as learning how to do bunny hops. The children said they enjoyed learning to balance on one leg as part of the "tick, tock, stop the clock" and they also enjoyed learning all the gymnastic positions. They can't wait for next week!







Reception children have also started gymnastic lessons this term and they have had two wonderful lessons where children have learnt parts of warm-up routine, how to balance on a bench, how to land safely and how to make a variety of shapes (star, stretch and pencil) with their bodies. Reception children have engaged wholeheartedly with these lessons, trying their hardest to make quite challenging shapes and to follow the sequence of movements that they have been shown. Berry, our lovely gymnastics teacher, has been amazed by their behaviour and attitude to learning. Awesome!



Reception children made bread rolls last week, as part of their exploration of the Little Red Hen, a familiar traditional text. Children mixed the ingredients, learnt about leaving the dough to rise, and then kneaded the dough before making rolls to bake. They had such an enjoyable time and the bread was delicious! Well done everyone.















WP School Council 2023-24

Here are the latest ideas and updates from our meeting this week.

Can we have a table tennis club? This was discussed and decided that it would be better to have a table tennis tournament as there are only two tables (it wouldn't be a very big club).

Can we organise a crazy dress up day? In theory yes. However, we need to have a focus and purpose, just as we do on Red Nose Day and World Book Day. The School Council are going to have another think and bring ideas to a meeting later in the term.




We have a very exciting project happening this year and we need your help!
