Dear parents,

We have had a busy start to the term and you will see looking through this packed edition of the PP what we have been up to.

We are delighted to see that the scaffolding is slowly being removed. After meeting with the contractors this week, the anticipated end date for the works is half term. We cannot wait to see the building in its entirety and for our youngest children and their families they have not known WP without its plastic wrapper! We are looking forward to looking out the windows and seeing the sky! I have said to the children we might have to have a party when it's all gone! We have sent a number of letters recently about attendance. We have had an increasing number of families asking for time off school to go on holiday. In the week before the Christmas holiday and the first week back we had a number of children who did not come in to, or return to school and we knew that the family was away, as we had been informed via an email. This is not following school policy for absence requests and those absences have been classed as unauthorised.

The impact of these absences is that our overall attendance level is currently 94%, which is very low. The expected level of attendance is 96% or above and we have always achieved that, so this is incredibly disappointing. What is more concerning is the impact on the children and their progress and relationships with friends. Schools have 13 weeks of holiday a year and I would ask that families take their own holidays during that time.

All absences need to be requested in advance, using the absence request form that is available on the website or in the office and if there is an exceptional circumstance, the absence will be authorised. All other requests will not, including

those where we have been told that the family is away. I am confident that we can work together to improve our overall attendance level and achieve the target that we set each year of 96% or above.

Finally, Charlotte has decided to leave William Patten. She would like to say a heartfelt thank you to the staff she has worked with over the years and that she will miss all the families and children she has had the pleasure of meeting and teaching. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Charlotte for her contribution to the school and wish her the best for the future.

EYFS children have had a wonderful start to our topic of 'Authors', our focus topic for this half-term. Last week our core book was Nick Sharratt's version of 'Goldilocks'. Nursery children explored capacity by filling bowls with different amounts of porridge to indicate if the bowl was empty, nearly empty, half full, nearly full and full. Children also made wonderful bear masks. What fun we had! Reception children worked hard to find number bonds to 5 and then 10, labelled objects in the Three Bears' house, sequenced key events in the story and also wrote wanted posters for Goldilocks. They also explored capacity, using different containers and porridge, and made wonderful bear masks. Busy, busy, busy!























Nursery are enjoying our new topic on Authors. We have looked at stories by the author Oliver Jeffers. We have been talking about and drawing the story "How to catch a star". The children worked hard to recall what events happened in the story, trying hard to draw the events and then using great words to talk about their favourite part of the story. Two Nursery children then asked to write a page of the book after they had finished their pictures. We were super impressed with their letter formation, their interest in writing and talking about letter sounds as well as their focus and attention to concentrate for an extended period of time. Well done Nursery!







EYFS children started gymnastic lessons this term and so far we have had two wonderful lessons where children have learnt parts of warm-up routine, how to balance on a bench, how to land safely and how to make a variety of shapes (star, stretch, tuck and pencil) with their bodies. EYFS children have engaged wholeheartedly with these lessons, trying their hardest to make quite challenging shapes and to follow the sequence of movements that they have been shown. Berry, our lovely gymnastics teacher, has been amazed by their behaviour and attitude to learning. Awesome!



#### Our new Language of the Month is French!

We have many French speaking children at William Patten and Helen was joined by Darcey 1H, Hirokaï 1H, Soan 2C, Stella 2YN, Sophia 3L, Marcelo 4C, Ciro-Mael 4A and Hamza 5I in the virtual whole school assembly to introduce French as the new Language of the Month. During the assembly, all of the classes learnt many facts about France such as: France is the largest country in Europe and the capital city of France is Paris. France shares borders with eight countries: Belgium, Germany, Luxembourg, Switzerland, Italy, Monaco, Andorra and Spain (which is the longest border). France is well known for its stunning landmarks and attractions such as the Eiffel Tower, Arc de Triomphe, Sacre Coeur Cathedral and the Loire castles. The official language of France is French and the population of France is 68 million people (11 million people live in Paris). It is a country made up of cities, mountains, countryside and beach towns. It can be very warm in the summer, up to about 40C, and cold in the winter. Interestingly, there are French territories in other parts of the world like in South America, the Caribbean and also French territory islands in the Atlantic and Indian oceans. France is very famous for its food! It is known for delicious baguette, pastries, crepe, stews and cheeses. French bakeries are called patisseries where you would be able to buy yummy bread, pastries and cakes. France is also very well known for its art and fashion; some famous French artists include Monet and Matisse and Paris is known as the fashion capital of the world. France is also known for a very famous sporting event: Tour de France! For three weeks in July every year the world's best cyclists compete in a bike cycling race and they cycle for 2,235 miles (don't worry, they do stop cycling to eat and sleep). French is a romance language and it is not only spoken in France but it is also the official language in 29 other countries such as Belgium, Luxembourg, Canada, Switzerland and some countries in Africa. French uses the Roman alphabet like English but our letters and sounds are pronounced differently and some of the letters in the French language have accents é, è, c. Many words in the English language come from French like: theatre, cream, cinema, energy, balloon and many more.
