Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Understand gradually how others might be feeling discuss about character feelings throughout stories.
- Jigsaw SEAL theme -Celebrating Differences
- Explaining knowledge and asking questions about the topic.
- Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting -- work as part of a team in the Christmas show.
- Play with one or more children extending on and elaborating play ideas
- Discussing Nursery Rules remember rules without needing to be reminded by an adult
- Increasingly follow rules understanding why they are important.

Literacy - Reading

Literacy - Writing

- Make marks on their picture to stand for their name-
- Name writing (self-registration)
- Add marks to drawings to add meaning to their work – Xmas, superhero and environmental drawings.
- Write with a purpose in mind Xmas cards, Xmas activities, letter to Father Xmas, letter to/from a fantasy character
- Describing characters from the story
- Write Xmas and adventure stories -Mini books
- Write some or all of their name

Expressive arts and design

- Begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment like animal sets, dolls and dolls houses, etc. - Dressing up/role play area, Knights and dragons
- Create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills – Make a class castle, superhero masks, treasure maps ,superheroes, Paperbag Princess puppets
- Witch's play dough moulding
- Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody – Xmas show
