Reception children enjoyed making bread last week, as part of our work inspired by the Little Red Hen. Children helped to weigh the ingredients and carefully followed the recipe to make bread rolls. They enjoyed mixing the ingredients, kneading the dough and then forming the rolls. They were very patient and waited until the end of the day before eating their rolls. Their verdict – delicious!



Year 5 had a fantastic visit to the Hackney School of Food last week as part of their DT learning on bread-making. With the help of Chef Michelle and Chef Tom, they learned how to make focaccia and wholemeal soda bread. Working in groups of three, they carefully measured out ingredients, kneaded the dough, and added a range of delicious toppings. The session was a brilliant hands-on experience, and the children loved developing their practical skills and eating their delicious bread.



EYFS children started gymnastic lessons this term and so far we have had two wonderful lessons where children have learnt parts of warm-up routine, how to make a variety of shapes (star, stretch, tuck and pencil) with their bodies and how to land safely. EYFS children have engaged wholeheartedly with these lessons, trying their hardest to make quite challenging shapes and to follow the sequence of movements that they have been shown. Berry, our lovely gymnastics teacher, has been amazed by children's behaviour and attitude to learning as well as their ability to listen and follow instructions. Awesome!








